



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THE CDL IMPACT

QuickFacts' Growth

CDL's mentorship had a transformative impact on QuickFacts' fundraising strategy. Although the company launched with a strong product idea, co-founder Christy Barsalou admitted "we had absolutely no idea what we were doing" when it came to raising capital. CDL provided practical guidance on structuring their pre-seed round and sharpening their investor pitch, which not only helped them secure early funding from program connections but also gave them lasting strategic support.

CDL also pushed QuickFacts to think beyond funding and focus on scalable, long-term growth. This shift in mindset led to major operational improvements, including clear sales KPIs, a smoother client onboarding process, and a stronger emphasis on Net Promoter Score (NPS) and customer feedback. These changes were embedded company-wide, supported by defined OKRs and improved internal systems. Two CDL mentors now serve on the company's Board of Directors.

The results speak for themselves! Since graduating from CDL Prime in May 2023, QuickFacts has grown its customer base by 570% and achieved a 102% customer retention rate. Their platform has saved brokerages an estimated 500,000 hours, allowing advisors to spend more time focused

on clients. The company expanded across Canada, launched U.S. pilots, and secured a U.K. partnership.

Zero Energy Water's Path to Market and \$1M Milestone

Zero Energy Water (ZEW) is revolutionizing seawater desalination with its patented graphene nano-plate membrane, offering up to 90% energy savings over traditional reverse osmosis. Designed as a drop-in replacement for existing desalination systems, ZEW's technology enables scalable adoption without major infrastructure changes. Over the past year at CDL-Atlantic, ZEW secured key Letters of Intent, hit its \$1M fundraising

target, advanced IP filings, completed manufacturing milestones, and strengthened its team to position the company for rapid, global growth.

Culminating a year of exceptional progress, Zero Energy Water was selected as CDL-Atlantic's featured venture at Super Session in Toronto, where it showcased its transformative potential on the program's global stage.

- Rashmi Prakash (Aruna Revolution, CDL'24) is reshaping sustainable hygiene with products designed to support both people and the planet.
- Ryan Marshall (Myomar Molecular, CDL'22) is pioneering new diagnostics for muscle degeneration, helping enable earlier and more effective treatment.



These founders spoke candidly about how CDL helped them refine their business models, connect with world-class mentors, and access the capital needed to grow. Their stories underscore what we see again and again: CDL-Atlantic equips entrepreneurs with the tools and networks to take bold ideas from the lab to the global stage.

As Rashmi put it, the program gave her "the confidence to think globally from day one." That mindset, combined with science, grit, and mentorship, continues to fuel breakthroughs locally, nationally, and globally.

3DBioFibR Celebrates Breakthrough Year with \$3M Raise and Innovation Award

In June 2025, Halifax-based 3DBioFibR (CDL'21) raised \$3M CAD in equity funding to scale its innovative biopolymer fiber platform. The round was backed by leading investors, including Build Ventures and Invest Nova Scotia.

3DBioFibR also received the Innovation Award at the 2024 Discovery Awards, recognizing its dry-spinning technology that enables commercial-scale production of collagen fibers mimicking the body's natural extracellular matrix.

Elle, MD Biotechnologies Wins NBIF Fueling Female Pitch Competition \$100K Prize.

Jennifer Johnston, MD, founder of Elle, MD Biotechnologies (CDL'24), won the \$100K CAD prize in the New Brunswick Innovation Foundation's Fueling Female Founder Pitch Competition at the 2025 Atlantic Venture Forum. A family physician and assistant professor at Dalhousie University, Dr. Johnston launched Elle, MD in 2022 to develop a user-controlled, pain-free, hormone-free contraceptive. The prize package included entry into due diligence with NBIF, a potential match with Invest Nova Scotia, Firehood sponsorship, and coaching from Rivet.

Aruna Revolution Secures \$250K Deal on Dragons' Den for Sustainable Hygiene Innovation

Aruna Revolution (CDL'24) landed a \$250K CAD deal for 25% equity with Dragons Michele Romanow and Manjit Minhas on the season finale of Dragons' Den Canada!

Headquartered in Nova Scotia and led by a powerhouse team of women engineers and experts, Aruna is transforming the hygiene industry with sustainable, compostable menstrual products. Their Dragons' Den feature gave national recognition to their mission to build a more circular, inclusive, and eco-conscious future.

NovaResp - 2025 Innovative Business of the Year

NovaResp (CDL'22) was named Innovative Business of the Year at the 2025 Halifax Business Awards! Founder & CEO, Dr. Hamed Hanafi accepted the award on behalf of the team.

Headquartered in Halifax, Nova Scotia, NovaResp is redefining sleep apnea treatment through advanced Al. Their patented software, cMAPTM, integrates with any Positive Airway Pressure (PAP) device, including CPAPs, to optimize therapy in real-time.

Aquaai Wins Silicon Valley Club's Deep Tech Unicorn Battle

Aquaai (CDL'20) took top honours at the Silicon Valley Club's Deep Tech Unicorn Battle, standing out among more than 1,000 applicants and six finalists, most of them focused on space technology. The winner was selected by a panel of nearly 20 global investors and experts, who recognized Aquaai's strong potential for climate impact.

Aquaai is a water intelligence company that makes environmental data more accessible, affordable, and actionable. Its technology significantly reduces the cost and complexity of water data collection, helping industries and governments better manage water risk, sustainability, and climate resilience.



Infusd Nutrition Raises \$2M and Partners with Symrise to Take Nutrient Delivery Global

Infusd Nutrition (CDL'24) is scaling fast having raised a **\$2M USD** seed round and partnering with the global flavor leader, Symrise.

Led by Next Gen Nutrition Investment Partners, with participation from Nourish Ventures, Agthia Group, Cerity Partners Ventures, and others, the funding will be used to accelerate the commercialization of Infusd's breakthrough solubility technology, which turns fat-soluble and insoluble nutrients into water-soluble, bioavailable forms.

As part of its partnership with Infusd, Symrise will launch a new product line within its
Active Living Portfolio, featuring premium,
Infusd-enabled ingredients like water-soluble
Omega-3. This collaboration combines
Symrise's market reach with Infusd's solubility
technology to deliver innovative, clean-label solutions.

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Pain Coach Inc. Wins Top Prize at Innovation Den

Emily Johnston, PhD, founder of **Pain Coach Inc.** (CDL'25), won the \$100K CAD New Path Award for Health Innovation at the 2025 QEII Foundation Innovation Den. Pain Coach is a digital health platform that provides personalized, evidence-based pain management guidance for patients recovering from surgery.

The win highlights Dr. Johnston's leadership in advancing patient-centered care and developing solutions that ease the burden on both individuals and the healthcare system.

Permalution's Tatiana Estevez Named Changemaker for Tackling Global Water Scarcity

Tatiana Estevez, Founder & CEO of **Permalution** (CDL'23), was recognized as a Changemaker by The Globe and Mail and named a CEO Water Champion by the World Bank, a testament to her bold vision in addressing the global water crisis.

Permalution's innovative system uses a combination of a predictive atlas, radar sensors, and fog collectors to harvest 150 to 2,000 liters of safe drinking water per unit, per day, directly from fog. Currently being piloted in Abu Dhabi, the technology is attracting global interest as a scalableclimate-resilient solution to water scarcity in some of the world's most vulnerable regions.

Planetary Winner of \$1M XPRIZE for Ocean Carbon Removal

Planetary (CDL'22) was named one of the \$1M USD XPRIZE Carbon Removal XFACTOR Award winners, one of the most prestigious climate innovation prizes in the world.

Based in Nova Scotia, Planetary was selected from over 1,300 global teams for its groundbreaking work in ocean alkalinity enhancement, a process that restores seawater chemistry to help remove carbon from the atmosphere. This achievement reinforces that ocean restoration isn't just feasible, it's critical to solving the climate crisis.

XOCEAN Raised €115M in One of Ocean-Data Sector's Largest Funding Rounds

XOCEAN (CDL'19) raised €115M, making it one of the largest funding rounds in the ocean-data sector. Backed by global investors including S2G Ventures, Climate Investment, and Morgan Stanley's 1GT fund, the raise will fuel international expansion and accelerate deployment of XOCEAN's low-emission Uncrewed Surface Vessels (USVs), which deliver high-resolution marine data with just 0.1% of the emissions of traditional ships.

uFraction8 Lands £3.4M to Scale Sustainable Biotech Filtration Tech

uFraction8 (CDL'19) has secured £3.4M to advance its energy-efficient microfiltration technology, designed to revolutionize

bioprocessing in industries such as biopharma, microalgae, and alternative proteins. With facilities in Scotland and Poland, the company plans to focus its efforts on scaling its patented technology and reducing production costs, as it targets the \$30B bioseparation market.


Phoenix Waste Solutions Wins \$100K Ocean Exchange Grant

Phoenix Waste Solutions (CDL'24) was selected as the 2024 Neptune® Award winner, granting them a \$100K USD prize from Ocean Exchange. Their groundbreaking low-carbon waste management technology reduces municipal waste into a 1% non-toxic ash without using fossil fuels and reduces the need for long-haul transportation of waste, reducing CO2 emissions.

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Following the successful launch of the 2023–24 Oceans Stream at MIT, CDL-Atlantic leveraged new relationships forged in Boston to bring the final Oceans Session of the 2024–25 cohort to Bergen, Norway, in partnership with One Ocean Week.

Taking mentors, partners, and ventures across the ocean for a week of forward-thinking ocean programming further expanded the CDL Oceans network and strengthened its mission to support ventures making a critical impact in the ocean economy.

The week began with a Mentor-Partner Dinner hosted by Farvatn Ventures in the breathtaking Frescohallen, overlooking the historic Bryggen Wharf. As the sun set over one of Bergen's seven mountains, Torbjørn Torsvik, Kommunaldirektør of the Bergen Kommune, welcomed guests to the city and officially kicked off One Ocean Week.

The following day, CDL-Atlantic hosted Session 4 of CDL Oceans, welcoming attendees of One Ocean Week from around the world to engage with early-stage ocean tech founders whose ideas aim to disrupt and transform the ocean economy. As CDL mentors helped ventures set their final objectives before selecting the 2024–25 Oceans cohort graduates, newcomers to CDL brought fresh perspectives to the discussions.

CDL-Atlantic participants then took part in the broader One Ocean Week programming, beginning with the One



Ocean Science reception at the University of Bergen. There, they connected with innovative researchers contributing significantly to ocean sustainability.

Members of the CDL Oceans network were also invited to the One Ocean Summit. themed Sea Level Rise and Coastal Resilience for a Sustainable Future. The summit convened global stakeholders to address the critical challenges of sea level rise, coastal vulnerability, and the need for climate-resilient ocean management. Through international collaboration, knowledge exchange, and youth engagement, the summit explored sustainable adaptation strategies to protect coastal communities and ecosystems. Some participants joined the One Ocean Science Tour, which offered insights into various innovation centres, providing opportunities to meet local scientists and early-stage founders developing new ocean sustainability solutions, alongside the facilities and investors supporting their work.

CDL-Atlantic was honoured to attend the Sustainable Ocean Solutions (SOS) Kick-off event, a precursor to the SOS Summit in San Francisco in November 2025. The evening featured sea shanties, stories from seasoned sailors, and a preview of the important conversations expected at the upcoming summit. The week wrapped up at the One Ocean Conference, where participants engaged in critical discussions around the significance of the blue economy and ocean health amid shifting political landscapes.

Concluding the 2024–25 CDL Oceans program in Bergen, Norway, proved to be a fitting finale. The connections established during One Ocean Week sparked new conversations and laid the groundwork for ongoing crossborder collaborations in coastal regions around the world, as CDL-Atlantic continues to support ventures committed to a healthier ocean.

CDL APPRENTICE PROGRAM

Inspiring the Next Generation of Innovators

Through the CDL Apprentice Program, CDL-Atlantic welcomed high school students to three in-person sessions this year, giving young female identifying students early exposure to the world of science, entrepreneurship, and innovation. By shadowing mentors during real venture meetings, these students gained firsthand insight into startup culture and strategic thinking. As mentor Jen LaPlante reflected about her Apprentice, "Watching her take in the energy of the room, the tough questions posed to founders, and the real-world advice shared was a reminder of how powerful early exposure can be.
